Science Fun!		Nursery Rhymes / Art	Dough disco!
<p>Find a bowl and selection of containers suitable for using in water pouring activities. These might include pans, jugs, empty milk containers, plastic mugs, etc. Ensure the water is at a safe temperature. Let the children empty and fill with the water. Which container holds the most? How many cups of water go into the pan? Add some washing up liquid or food colouring to explore what will happen to the water!</p>		<p>Practise singing your favourite nursery rhyme i.e. Incy Wincy Spider. Can you think of names that start with an 's' that you could call your spider? (This is great for early phonic activity). This could be done with other nursery rhymes.</p>	<p>Practise those fine motor skills by listening to dough disco instructions! See videos on YouTube.</p>
<p>Practise your letter and number formation as well as practising writing your name.</p>	<p>Explore money! Look at the different coins (1p, 2p, 5p, 10p).</p>	<p>Draw a picture of something you have enjoyed doing during the pandemic. Discuss your picture with your family.</p>	<p>Creative Make a sock puppet with items you have in your home.</p>
<p>Practise counting forwards and backwards to 10 using songs and rhymes. (You will find a good selection on YouTube).</p>	<p>Read a story with your family. Encourage your child to discuss the whole picture.</p>	<p>Go on a treasure hunt! Can you find items that are green/red/blue etc. Are they all the time? How do they look? Sort the items into categories.</p>	<p>Watch a welsh show on S4C and practise the term 'Beth wyt ti'n hoffi?' What do you like? Dwi'n hoffi ... I like ...</p>
<p>Read the eBook 'We are all different' with your family. Discuss the story as a family and think about the similarities and differences between you. Differences are a good thing – that's what make us special and unique. Ask your family questions about their favourite food, toys, activities etc. What do you have in common? Draw a picture of your family.</p>		<p>Creative play. Using your home made or pots of playdough, make a pretend lunch or tea. It could be your own shop, café or restaurant. Imagine rolling the dough to make a delicious pizza. What toppings would you include? Or how about a delicious cake for a birthday or special event? Encourage your child to use lots of detail when discussing their creations.</p>	
<p>Read the story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. This story has a lot of descriptive words such as hot, cold, lumpy, soft and hard. Why not go around your home and see what items you can find to create a sensory game. What could you find that is smooth/fluffy?</p> <p>Addition task – Make some porridge. What do you need to make porridge? How does it taste? Take lots of pictures of you helping your grown-ups. Can you find three bowls for the bears? Think about the size of the bowls. Who will have the biggest/smallest?</p>
